Scholarly Communication Fellowship Generously Funded by the UNM Center for Regional Studies

The Scholarly Communication Fellowship is awarded to a graduate student enrolled at the University of New Mexico to assist in maintaining UNM's online scholarly resources, including the Digital Commons Repository, Online electronic journals, and the Searchable Ornithological Research Archive. This fellowship will provide a valuable introduction to a variety of scholarly communication issues, open access and online publishing practices, and the management of digital scholarship services.

Fellowship Duties and Responsibilities

The fellow will work closely with DISC staff to post electronic theses and dissertations, faculty publications, and University Archives materials using the UNM Digital Repository system (digitalrepository.unm.edu), where they will be available for students, researchers and the public. The fellow will also assist with the management of UNM open access journals and the SORA Ornithological Research Archive. Depending on the Fellow's research interests, there are opportunities to help implement new scholarly resources and develop digital exhibits showcasing UNM scholarly content. The fellow will be required to give a presentation on their fellowship experience during the spring, 2019 semester.

Position Requirements

Fellows should have good writing, communication and customer service skills, experience working with Adobe Acrobat and Microsoft Office, and have some basic experience adding content to websites or databases. In addition:

1. Applicants must be graduate students in residence at the University of New Mexico and have completed a minimum of 6 credit hours toward their degree. Fellows are required to be registered for a minimum of 6 hours each semester during the fellowship period.
2. Applicants must be making good academic progress and within the time limit for completion of their degree program.
3. Applicants must be legally authorized to work in the United States.
4. Fellows will be expected to meet all [Center for Regional Studies Fellowship Requirements](#).

Terms of the Award

The award is \$15,000 for the academic year. The fellow will work 20 hours per week during fall and spring semesters. Fellowships typically begin one week before the start of classes and end the last day of finals each semester, excepting UNM holidays. Fellows must abide by Center for Regional Studies Fellowship requirements.

Application Requirements

1. A completed application form (see below).
2. A letter of application specifically addressing your qualifications for the fellowship.
3. Two letters of recommendation from individuals familiar with your academic or work experience.
4. Your current Résumé or Curriculum Vitae.
5. Academic Transcripts (Xerox copies are acceptable for the application. Official copies are required for Fellowship recipients).
6. Deadline for Receipt of Applications is June 15, 2018.
